Information on conference procedures

1. Online participation will be enabled via GoogleMeet. To ensure that your participation runs smoothly we recommend using a Google (GMail) account, and making sure that your camera, speakers and microphone are functioning at least a day before the conference. **We emphasize that all participants should be logged into the sessions 5 minutes before the beginning of each session. Our technicians will be waiting to “let you in” when you click on the link to join. We also emphasize that the same links should be used by conference participants who are not in a particular panel (because their own panel is at a different time) but wish to listen to the presentations and join the discussion.** The links for the sessions and panels are the following:
